

#### **FREE TRADE AGREEMENTS**

Tunisia is a signatory to 52 double taxation agreements and 54 bilateral agreements for the promotion and protection of investments. These agreements include:

- A bilateral free trade area agreement with Turkey,
- A free trade area agreement with the European Free Trade Association countries,
- The Agadir free trade agreement between Jordan, Egypt, Morocco and Tunisia,
- Bilateral free trade area agreements with Libya, Egypt, Morocco, Jordan and Iraq,
- An agreement establishing the Pan Arab Free Trade Area with 18 countries of the League of Arab States.
- Tunisia is the 20<sup>th</sup> member of the COMESA trade agreement.



#### ADVANCED PARTNER WITH EUROPE

• Tunisia is the first country in the southern Mediterranean that signed an Association and Free Trade Agreement with the European Union.

• Tunisia also has the status of **Advanced Partner** with the European Union. This status has the potential to strengthen Tunisia's trade liberalisation and economic integration.

• The signing of a **Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Agreement (DCFTA)** is underway to ensure the progressive integration of Tunisia into the EU internal market and the construction of a Common Economic Space.

#### CONVENTION ON THE AFCFTA

In July 2020, Tunisia ratified the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

Tunisia joined the **Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)** Declaration on International Investment and Multinational Enterprises in 2012.




#### UTILITY COSTS

### **ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE**

Tunisia offers easy access to electricity consumed mainly by the industrial sector (29%). Tunisia focuses its renewable energy production on wind energy, solar energy, bioenergy and geothermal energy.

### **DIGITAL INFRASTRUCTURE**

Tunisia has placed ICT as a national priority. The sector has recorded major achievements over the last few years, particularly in the field of digital infrastructure.

Tunisia is one of the first countries in North Africa and the Arab region to adopt **e-Learning**.

• about 65,000 new graduates

• **over 30 %** of new graduates trained in engineering, computer science, multimedia and technical curricula,

• more than 300,000 enrolled university students.

# INVESTMENT FRIENDLY FRAMEWORK

- **Full freedom** of foreign equity participation for offshore companies,
- Reduction in the number of authorisations and review of specifications,
- Free access to **land ownership** for investment purposes,
- Guarantees of fair and equitable treatment and protection of industrial and intellectual property for investors,

• **Freedom** dto transfer funds (profits, dividends and assets) abroad.

New provision in the **2021 Finance Law:** corporate tax rate reduction from 25% to 15% (including profits from exports), starting with the (local or export) profits of fiscal year 2021, to be reported in 2022.

Specific regulations and procedures govern intellectual property rights. They are consolidated by the law on the protection of personal data.

Tunisia is a member of **ICSID** (International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes).

#### Tax and financial incentives:

- Total exemption from VAT and customs duties on the inputs of the products to be re-exported,

- **Total exemption of profits** for up to 10 years for companies located in regional development zones, followed by a reduced rate of 10% after the exemption period,

- **Premium** of up to **30% of the investment cost,** capped at TND 3 million for companies located in regional development zones,

- **Premium** for intangible investment and research & development expenditure of up to **50% of costs,** capped at TND 500,000 and TND 300,000 respectively,

- Investment premium of 15% of the costs, capped at 1 MTND, granted for priority sectors and economic sectors,

- **Subsidy** of the employer's contribution during the first 3 years of effective activity for employees of Tunisian nationality recruited for a first permanent job,

- **Subsidy** of the cost of training programmes leading to certification representing **up to 70%** of the cost of the initial training and capped at 20,000 TND.

Tunisia ranks **61<sup>st</sup>** in the world in terms of minority investor protection.
